- Copyright
- Database rights
- Patents?

Computer Software and Intellectual Property Rights

Copyright

- Unregistered right
- Work must be original and result of skill, labour and judgement
- Concerned with the material expression of ideas
- Does not protect the ideas themselves
- Principally to protect reproduction of the copyright work

Computer software and copyright

- Protects computer programs, which includes:
 - preparatory design material eg specifications, flowcharts etc
 - source code/object code
- Does not protect:
 - ideas and principles underlying a computer program
- Must have a human author

Computer Software and Intellectual Property Rights

Ownership of copyright

- Author is first owner.
- If in course of employment then employer is first owner
- Joint authorship
- Commissioned works

Computer Software and Intellectual Property Rights

Infringement

- Copying
- Transient copying included
- Literal copying
 - question of fact
- Non literal copying
 - more difficult to prove
- Substantial part
 - quantitative/qualitative approach

Computer Software and Intellectual Property Rights

Permitted acts

- Reverse engineer/decompile if
 - act performed by a licensee or person having a right to use a copy of the program
 - necessary to obtain the information to achieve the interoperability of the program with other programs provided and that information is not readily available
 - acts confined to the parts of the program which are necessary to achieve interoperability

Permitted acts – cont'd...

- Adapting a program, subject to contractual term to the contrary
 - if necessary for lawful use

- Back up copies
 - by lawful user

Defences

- Internet and implied licence
- Non commercial use for private study and research

Computer Software and Intellectual Property Rights

Avoiding infringement

- Do not copy program ie the expression, but line between idea and the written computer program may be blurred
- When instructing programmers do not refer to an existing work
- Ensure all staff understand the basics of copyright
- If a licensee ensure you do not contract out of right to adapt program

- Link to home page as opposed to deep linking
- Technical solutions

Database rights

- Collection of independent works, data or other materials
- Arranged in a systematic or methodical way; and
- Individually accessible by electronic or other means

Definition of a patent

- Registered right
- Invention
 - new
 - Involve an inventive step
 - capable of industrial application
 - not excluded
- Monopoly

Ownership

- Inventor
- If in course of employment then employer is owner
- Commissioned works

Patenting software and business methods

- General prohibition on patentability of computer programs; but
- Patent office practice and technical effect

Computer Software and Intellectual Property Rights

Draft Directive on the Patentability of computer implemented inventions

Article 5 of Draft Directive

“Member states shall ensure that a computer implemented invention may be claimed as a product, that is a programmed computer, a programmed computer network, or other programmed apparatus, or as a process carried out by such a computer, computer network or apparatus through the execution of software”.

Infringement of patents

- All integers of the claim
- Indirect infringement by supplying the “means essential”
- Copying or knowledge of the patent not necessary

- Look for alternative ways
- Obtain a licence

Defences

- Implied licence
- Patent not valid

- Intellectual property is just like any property

 - steps to ensure you have good title
 - consider patent filings
